AUTHOR OF *THE BROTHER GARDENERS* TO PRESENT TALK AT LIBRARY

AUBURN – Andrea Wulf, author of *The Brother Gardeners: Botany, Empire & The Birth of an Obsession*, will present a talk on Thursday, June 4 at 3 p.m. in the Special Collections and Archives Department of the Ralph Brown Draughon Library at Auburn University.

The Brother Gardeners is the fascinating story of a small group of eighteenth-century naturalists who made Britain a nation of gardeners and the epicenter of horticultural and botanical expertise. It is the story of a garden revolution that began in America.

Andrea Wulf is co-author, with Emma Gieben-Gamal, of *This Other Eden: Seven Great Gardens and 300 Years of English History*. She has written for the *Sunday Times*, the *Financial Times*, *The Garden*, the *Architects' Journal*, and regularly reviews for several newspapers, including the *Guardian* and the *Times Literary Supplement*. She is a regular contributor to BBC radio and television.
